# The Trail to ATV Safety-Ride Safe, Ride Smart!

In 2013 there were 36 All Terrain Vehicle related injuries & 2 fatalities involving ATV's in Sask. ATV injuries are on the rise. Data from CIHI (Canadian Institute for Health Information) shows that there was a 31% increase of ATV injuries in the last decade.

Due to the increased speeds of the machines; injuries are serious ranging from fractures & broken bones to spinal cord & brain injuries.

### **SAFETY TIPS FOR RIDERS**

- 1. Wear an approved ATV helmet
- 2. Wear protective eye wear
- 3. Get Trained
- 4. Ride with a Buddy
- 5. Do not carry a passenger if your ATV is not built for it
- 6. Drive at Safe speeds
- 7. Stop at all crossings to ensure it is safe
- Respect Wildlife/Respect the Environment
- 9. Drinking/Drugs & Riding Don't Mix





Riding ATV in public areas

- Drivers must be 16 years old
- Drivers must hold a valid drivers license
- Youth between 12—15 can operate an ATV in public areas (can cross roads, but not drive on roads) **IF** they have passed an approved training course and are supervised by someone who has had their license for more than 1 year.

Did you know that your ATV needs to be insured to ride in public areas?

Did you know mini bikes and dirt bikes are also considered All Terrain Vehicles?
