


What is *Brain Walk*?

Brain Walk is an interactive ‘walk’ through the brain, delivered in a 10 station circuit formation. Each station highlights an area or lobe of the brain, and the corresponding function of that lobe. In addition, there are stations devoted to healthy minds; protecting the brain from injury, drugs and alcohol; and the difficulties experienced after injuring the brain.



How does *Brain Walk* work?

Each station contains an informational script, interactive demonstrations and activities.

A group of 60 students, sub-divided into 10 small groups, attend each station in 5 minute intervals.

Adult volunteers or students (Grade 8 or older) manage each station. The easy to follow script ensures that, aside from the orientation immediately prior to the event, no further training or expertise is required.

Who should participate in *Brain Walk*?

Brain Walk specifically targets children in grades Kindergarten to Grade 6, but the knowledge is beneficial for any age.

What do you need to host *Brain Walk*?

- School Gymnasium/Community Hall
- Participants/Students
- Volunteers (Minimum 12)
- Tables/Chairs (10)
- Time (~1 hour per group of 60 participants)
- No fee is charged for *Brain Walk* to come to your school or community
